2020: A Year or Growth



What a year 2020 has been!

It would have been reasonable to assume that the global travel restrictions would have hindered our progress towards our goal of establishing a global network of leadership training centers. We could have understandably been discouraged or distracted by the tremendous challenges introduced by the global pandemic.

By the grace of God the opposite is true!

The Bible verse most shared, bookmarked, and highlighted on the YouVersion Bible app in 2020 was Isaiah 41:10: "Don't be afraid, for I am with you. Don't be discouraged, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you. I will hold you up with my victorious right hand."

We are overjoyed to report that we have seen God's right hand hold us in 2020 as we made significant progress towards our goal of seeing 20 schools established around the world. We have added two new schools to our network, Southern Africa and South Texas Schools of Missions, for a global presence of 12 schools.

2020 another significant milestone in our development. From our inception, our only source of funding was the proceeds generated by the generous gift given by Tom Beam. Last year for the first time we received outside donations which accounted for 27 % of our total revenue. These gifts also allowed us to end the year with a small surplus.

Our capacity to make a difference in the mission field has benefited from an investment in infrastructure, mainly people, to position the Beam Missions Foundation as a catalyst for the training of the next generation of leadership in the ICOC. There is an urgent and universal need for well trained ministry staff both inside and outside the United States. Our mission is to act decisively to address this most critical need.




Mission Statement

Our vision is to double our effectiveness in the next five years as we continue to inspire young, zealous and gifted men and women to take the lead in the next generation of world evangelization. Our goal is to support 15 schools with a total enrollment of 250 students in training by 2022, with a dream of growing to 20 schools by 2025. This should bring us to the goal of having 40 leaders on staff per year until 2022 to reach 250 and then 100 by the year 2025!


New England School of Missions

The New England School of Missions was the original pilot school funded by the Beam Missions Foundation. Established in 2010, NESM became the prototype school that the other programs would be modeled after. For the past decade NESM has graduated 38 students and has sent out half of them to serve churches overseas in London, Oxford, Zurich, Madrid, Milan, Prague, Berlin, Budapest, and Sydney.

South Pacific School of Missions

The SPSM was established in 2012 and is led by Mike Fontenot as the director and Sam Cameron as the lead trainer. The first session took place in Sydney with an attendance of around 20 students. They started with 161 members in the Sydney Church and 750 in the region at the beginning of 2013. Since that time, God has graciously been building up the region and Mission School. Since the start of the school, there have been 26 full time ministry staff that have been trained along with two part time. Five new graduates are expected to be added to the list in 2021. Currently, there are 19 students that are full time on staff and 4 that are part time. God is using the school to make a tremendous impact on the region.









Bangalore School of Missions

Since 2012, the School of Missions (SOM) in Bangalore has been training young people with a missionary vision to equip them to return to their communities and serve in the ministry. The SOM continues to play an active role in the mission work.

Since 2019 there has been mission focus for Bangalore. As a result, two new churches have been planted in India. The students of the School of Missions had a great opportunity to be in the mission field, They were all placed in one of the two mission teams that were sent out.







In the last 6 months, the mission team has reached out to hundreds of people and studied the bible with plenty of them. The SOM trainees played a big role in reaching out to many souls in Kalaburagi. They have also been instrumental in studying the bible and baptizing those 14 souls who were added in the kingdom.


European School of Missions

West Africa (Onyechi Emeka Oguagha) School of Missions

The West Africa School of Missions, based in Lagos, Nigeria, was established in 2016 and has been one of our most successful new schools. The region is in great need of young leadership. God has brought together students from different countries and tribes, and this is bringing unity even through marriages that have developed amongst the students. The school of missions has infused faith and energy to the local congregations that are dreaming again for the future. Young people are excited to be trained and eager to serve God and their region of the world. The school is led by Chris Ogbonnaya. Since 2016, they have trained and graduated 11 ministry staff who are all currently serving on the mission field. They expect 2021 to be a fruitful year as well with 19 students being trained and 4 expected to graduate by the end of the year.


Atlanta School of Missions



Mexico City is the largest Spanish speaking city in the world with a metropolitan population of more than 20 million. It is also home to the second largest church in our fellowship with nearly 4,000. A few years ago, the leadership realized that there was a desperate need to train the next generation of leadership. In spite of having such a huge congregation, the youngest member on staff was nearly 40 years old. They approached the Beam Missions Foundation and devised a plan to get a School of Missions established. Fortunately, there were many young dreamers ready to devote their lives to serving the Lord and they had not only seasoned evangelists and women's ministry leaders to walk with these zealots, but an extremely capable teacher and administrator to complete the team.





After finishing our first generation of the LATAM SoM in December 2020 and graduating 10 students, we have understood the scope of this program and the great benefit that it has for the next generation. Now we are excited to begin our second generation with another 11 students from 5 churches in 2 different countries, and we really feel excited about what God will do with them in the next 3 years
