Beam Missions Foundation Grant Criteria Summary

BMF Mission

The exclusive purpose of the Beam Missions Foundation is the pursuit of Tom Beam's passionate vision for world missions.

After three years of a broader spectrum of mission ventures the BMF board has concluded that the optimal impact would be achieved by focusing on *leadership development*.

Leadership Development means building training centers or "Missions Schools" around the world. The goal of such leadership development centers is threefold:

- (1) To methodically train many young leaders as evangelists and missionaries
- (2) To inspire high-impact missions around the world
- (3) To effectively utilize resources of larger churches

Key Grant Criteria

1. Significant Mission Field Impact

a. Scope of the Mission

The training effort needs to be aligned with a significant mission field that provides natural progression opportunities for the graduates.

b. Quantity of Trainees

The schools should train 20+ students annually.

c. Quality of Trainees

The students should be already pre-qualified to be ministry interns.

2. Proven Training Capability

a. Established Track Record for Raising Up Ministers

The training effort needs to be led by a trainer with an excellent track record for raising up evangelists and women's ministry leaders.

b. Missions Experience in the Role of Evangelist

The trainer(s) must have a significant (5+ years) of direct missions experience.

c. Capability to Train Academically and Practically

Ideally leadership training methodically addresses both academics as well as practical leadership and ministry aspects.

3. Effective Training Environment

a. A Church with Own Training Resources

The hosting church must have sufficient resources (finances, ministries, leaders) to train a significant number of students as interns (1,000+ members).

b. A Church with Mature Leadership

The hosting church must provide a great leadership culture that is worthy of imitation for the students. It ideally includes all ecclesiastical roles (elders, evangelists, and teachers) and has developed great stewardship and excellent team leadership.

c. A Church with a Growth History

The hosting church needs to be a church that is consistently and solidly growing with a reputation of an inspiring missions culture.
